Early the next morning, Laban kissed his grandchildren and his daughters and blessed them. Then he left and returned home.



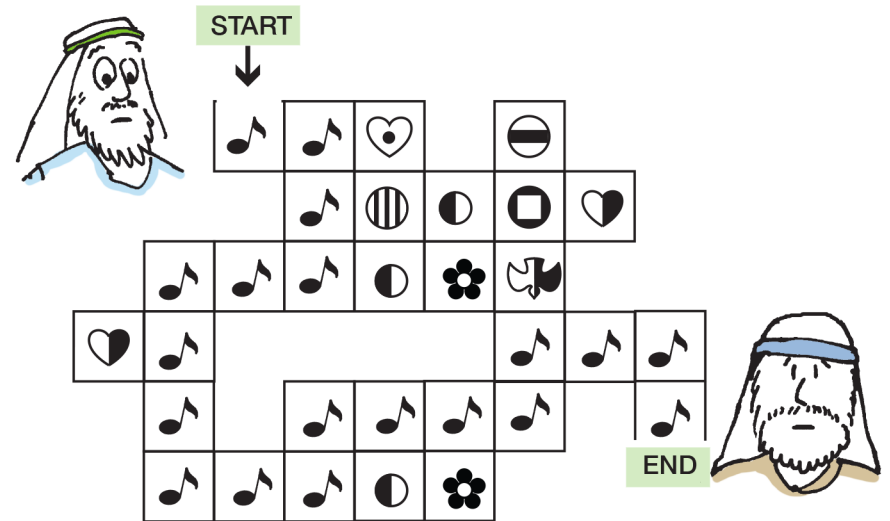

Follow the 🎵 to take Laban to Jacob.

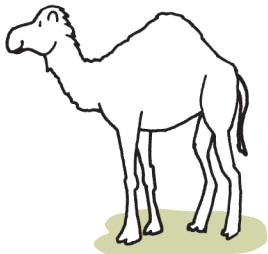


Laban said he would have sent Jacob off with joy and songs.

Circle the picture of the person who is angry.

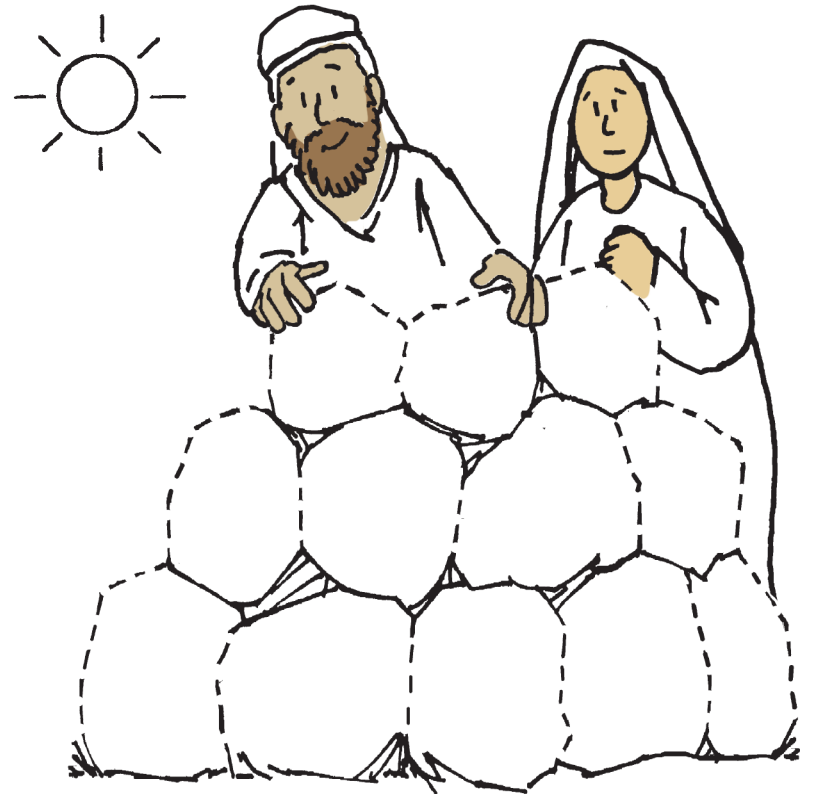
Then Jacob became angry and said to Laban, “What is my crime, that you hunt me down? I have been with you for 20 years now.
